Building Skills/Set Design (9-12)	F	9-1	Brandon Corolla	In Building Skills and Set Design, students will get to put their creativity to work on a larger scale. Aligned with the Drama program at The Learning Habitat, Building Skills and Set Design will challenge students to create large set pieces for a theatrical production. The Drama program aims to perform a live theatrical production, and students in this class will act as stage crew in such productions. Students will use hand and power tools to create unique backdrops utilizing wood and many other materials in the process. This class focuses first on safety standards, ensuring students understand the safe way to create using dangerous tools and materials. The goal for Building Skills and Set Design is for students to bring home practical skills with multiple hand and power tools and to empower students with the confidence to create on a larger scale.

Elementary STEAM	F	9-1	LaurenRoper, Erin Waldo	This class is geared toward 1st- 5th grade learners. This four-hour class consists of approximately 2 hours of instruction and activities. We then have a 30 minute lunch/ recess break, and 1.5 hours of more activities. The focus of this class will be to strengthen Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math skills in real-world and hands on applications.
